CIIE offers support to NU's young entrepreneurs. It serves as an incubation centre, offering guidance, mentorship, and resources to startup ventures. The expertise and guidance of faculty members, alumni, and industry experts are provided by CIIE in mentoring and guiding aspiring entrepreneurs. Seed funding is also available, to help startups kickstart their ventures. Networking events are organized to showcase startups and connect them with potential investors and financial institutions. CIIE provides startups with access to essential physical infrastructure and support systems, including libraries, laboratories, workshop facilities. On demand CIIE offers business support services like accounting, tax assistance, equipping startups with the tools needed to navigate the complexities of running a business. NU's fostering entrepreneurship has resulted in the establishment of more than 15 successful startups by its students and alumni. Notable examples include Astra Securities, a global leader in web application security founded by NU alumni Shikhil Sharma and Ananda Krishnan, and K Manoj Kumar's startup peerXP. The entrepreneurial achievements of NU students have been recognized through prestigious awards and accolades, showcasing the effectiveness of the NU's entrepreneurship ecosystem.

The Asian Lens Forum (TALF) was established on 15 February 2014 at NU, to provide Asian youth with a deeper understanding of their rich heritage, while fostering awareness, constructive engagement, and knowledge generation. It contributes to the global space, promoting values of cultural diversity, inclusivity, and a shared pursuit of knowledge and wisdom, always respecting intellectual property rights.
